





Lunch room rules and procedures are important


Come visit for lunch, but not right away

Health Information

- Please submit your child's immunization record to school office. Legal requirement to attend school.
- Inform school of allergies or special medical needs. Share <u>any medical conditions</u> (ex. Allergies, asthma, etc.) that your child may have with the health office.
- Together we will develop a plan for your child to make the transition to school easier.



Health Information

How to decide if your child should stay home from school.

- Has a fever of 100 degrees or more, and should remain home for 24 hours after the temp is normal without meds
- Has vomited or had diarrhea, and should remain home for 24 hours after it has stopped
- Has persistent cough, rash with fever, draining eyes or ears

FAQs About Kindergarten

Who will be my child's teacher?

Teacher assignments are mailed in late August

What is the procedure if my child is sick and cannot attend school?

Call the school office when you know your child will not be attending school on any given day or if they are tardy.

What days will my child have PE, library, art? Schedules will be sent home the first week of school.

How is the decision made to go outside for recess or not?

Decision is based on temperature and wind chill.



FAQs About Kindergarten

What is the best way to contact my child's teacher?
Send a note with your child, call the office, only use email if not urgent.

How are ipads used in Kindergarten?

Kinders use ipads at school only, not sent home.

What are Flexible Learning Days?

School is not in session, students do learning activities at home.

Will the students learn the pledge of allegiance?


Each day includes school announcements and the pledge.

What are the school security procedures?


In the fall we will have a secure entry to school. All visitors will be routed through the relocated front office.
